Primary Care Military Immunisation Training

(2 days / 14 hours)

This course meets Public Health England's National Minimum Standards for Immunisation Training and includes the new changes for 2019

Overview:

Registered Nurses, Healthcare Support Workers, Military Medics and Doctors, who are new to practice or require a comprehensive update, who will be delivering immunisations to military personnel.

This course is also suitable for clinicians who will be immunising infants and children as part of the UK National schedule.

Course Content:

- Introduction to immunology how vaccines work
- Vaccine preventable disease
- The aims of immunisation
- Detailed view of military schedules for recruits and routine military immunisations
- Overview of deployment specific immunisations
- Managing errors, incomplete and overseas schedules
- Issues and controversies with immunisations
- Legal issues of administering immunisations Prescribing/PSD/PGD
- Vaccine handling, storage & cold chain
- The immunisation consultation, communication and consent
- Record keeping, documentation & reporting
- Anaphylaxis and adverse events
- Increasing uptake and engagement

This training covers theory and simulated practice only. Attendance of this course does not confirm that the student is competent to undertake practical immunisations. Supervised practice must be completed in the clinical setting and the student's line manager is responsible for confirming that the student has gained sufficient practical competency before permitting independent practice.
